RE: A CHANGE IN RISK LEVEL

Dear All,

As influenza-like symptoms are no longer present in our residents, the Public Health Unit has ceased outbreak protocols. As a result, we have reviewed our Risk Assessment Matrix and we will move your Centre to Risk Level 3 on the Matrix effective from tomorrow, 10 September. At Risk Level 3, the following will now apply:

- Visitors will be permitted for up to 2 visitors per resident at any one time;
- Visiting hours will be from 9:30am – 11:30am and 2:30pm – 4:30pm daily;
- Children under the age of 16 will be permitted to visit;
- Temperature checks and monitoring for signs and symptoms of respiratory illness will continue on all residents;
- Temperature checks will continue on all parties entering the Centre;
- Physical distancing for all interactions between parties at the Centre will continue to be maintained;
- Large group activities and significant group outings will be postponed;
- On-site activities will be kept small and either outdoors or indoors with significant space between residents and staff;
- Residents will be able to leave the Centre, for example, with family.

If you have symptoms of respiratory illness including a cough or a cold, or if you have a fever or have lost your sense of taste or smell, we ask that you do not visit the Centre and that you speak to your General Practitioner and/or call the National Coronavirus hotline on 1800 020 080. If you are a resident and you have these symptoms, please notify the Centre Manager. Current flu vaccinations are still required for all visitors. If you have any questions, please get in touch with your Centre Manager as they would be happy to assist.
