RE: UPDATED VISITING RESTRICTIONS

Dear All,

We are writing to advise you that the Western Australian Premier has announced that as of 12:01am on Saturday, 1 May 2021, most restrictions in the Perth and Peel regions of Western Australia will return to pre-lockdown conditions. However, some transitional restrictions will remain in place for seven days until 12:01am, Saturday, 8 May 2021. For residential aged care centres, the following will apply from 12:01am on Saturday, 1 May 2021:

- One household is permitted to visit a resident per day;
- Masks are not required outside except where physical distancing is not possible;
- Masks are mandatory for indoor public venues, including in the workplace and on public transport;
- Anyone who has been in the Perth or Peel regions since April 17 but has since travelled to another region must wear a mask.
