RE: NEW DIRECTIVES FROM NSW HEALTH AND A CHANGE IN RISK LEVEL

Dear All,

We are writing to advise you that on 21 January 2021, NSW Health released new directives for residential aged care centres in New South Wales. Based on these updated directives, your centre is no longer located in an area of increased testing and as such visitors are now permitted to visit but limited to two visitors per resident per day.

Please note that two different people may visit each day as per the directives but that all staff and visitors must wear a mask when accessing the centre. There will also be restrictions for visitors from areas of increased testing. These visitors will be excluded unless they are providing essential care to residents or for compassionate reasons.

In addition, residents can attend outings such as medical appointments, visit locations in the community such as shops and cafes, and can attend family gatherings where there must be fewer than 5 people.

Based on these new directives, we have reviewed our Risk Assessment Matrix and will move your centre to Risk Level 4 effective immediately. For your reference, you can review the latest directives and a link to the areas of increased testing, at the following link:

If you are a resident and you have these symptoms, please notify the Centre Manager.
