## RE: A NEW AGED CARE DIRECTION FOR QUEENSLAND

Dear All,

We are writing to advise you that on 13 March 2021, Queensland Health released a new Aged Care Direction for Queensland. From 12 noon on 13 March 2021, Direction (No. 25) came into effect and it revokes the previous Direction (No.24). According to this new Direction, the following is now in place at your Centre:

- Visitors are restricted to residential aged care facilities within the restricted Local Government Areas of 'City of Brisbane, City of Ipswich, Logan City, Moreton Bay Region, Redland City' unless visiting an end of life resident
- Clause 32: Any person (other than a resident) permitted to enter a restricted facility must wear a single use surgical face mask
